## 30 new Champions of Regional Cooperation



Thirty (30) new regional grants to Civil Society Organizations (CSOs) across the Western Balkans were awarded in early May, as part of the second phase of the "Support to the Promotion of Civil Society Regional Actions in the Western Balkans" project.

This latest round of grants, part of the 4<sup>th</sup> Call for Proposals of the WBF-EU Joint Action, reinforces the longstanding commitment to empowering local actors in regional cooperation.

In total, 139 beneficiary organizations from 32 locations in the region have been included in the 30 awarded projects as leadapplicants or partners. The 30 awarded projects were selected from a record 417 applications.

The distribution of lead applicants was balanced, with a equal number of lead-applicants from each Contracting Party of the Western Balkans Region.

At the official Awarding Ceremony, Dr. Gjergj Murra, Executive Director of the Western Balkans Fund, highlighted the broader significance of these grants

"This is not just a celebration of selected projects. It is a celebration of ideas, of trust, of partnership, and above all, of the strong belief that regional cooperation is not merely a concept, but a living reality we are building, one project, one collaboration, one handshake at a time. None of this would have been possible without the support of the European Union," Dr. Murra stated.

Project Manager Mr. Fjordi Bisha emphasized the competitiveness and inclusivity of this call, noting that a record-breaking 416 applications were received. "This level of engagement reflects the inclusiveness and credibility of our Joint Action", Mr. Bisha underlined.

The awarded projects reflect the diversity of regional needs, with projects focused on regional cooperation, education, culture, sustainable development, the green agenda, gender equality, and the promotion of human rights.





# Partnership Workship with the grantees of the 4th CFP



From May 6-7, 2025, alongside the Awarding Ceremony of the 4<sup>th</sup> Call for Proposals of the Joint Action, we held different sessions of the Partnership Workshop.

Key areas of focus included:

- Financial management and reporting practices in line with transparency and accountability standards.
- design implementation Project and methodologies, encouraging strategic planning and measurable outcomes.
- Effective use of the Online Grant Management Platform for seamless administration.
- Outreach, visibility, and communication strategies to amplify the impact and reach of each project.

These sessions were carefully crafted to help grantees implement their projects in full alignment with regional priorities and European standards, while also strengthening cross-border cooperation and community engagement.

### Record participation at the Regional Informative Sessions

From January 27 to February 5, the Western Balkans Fund organized a comprehensive round of 12 in-person Informative sessions across the Region, two in each Contracting Party. Two additional online sessions were provided for all interested parties.

Over 500 participants from civil society, public institutions, and grassroots organizations attended, showing strong interest in the WBF-EU Joint Action Call for Proposals. This was one of the key reasons behind the record number of 417 registered complete applications at this Call for Proposals.

These sessions provided practical guidance on eligibility, application procedures, and partnership building, helping ensure that the grant scheme reaches a wide and inclusive pool of potential beneficiaries across the Western Balkans.




# A new platform of Regional match-making

At the Western Balkans Fund, we take pride in being more than a grant-awarding institution. We are also a proactive facilitator of regional partnerships. a role we have embraced with growing determination.

Our WBF Partnership Platform on Facebook, with over 3,500 active members, has already contributed to the formation of hundreds of partnerships, many of which successfully applied for and received WBF grants. This simple, community-driven space has proven that targeted matchmaking across borders is not only possible — it is deeply needed.

Building on this success, we are now taking steps to develop a dedicated, professional online further platform will that strengthen regional cooperation. The upcoming platform aims to become a comprehensive partnership hub, serving not only WBF Calls for Proposals, but also the wider ecosystem of civil society organisations, public institutions, educational entities, and individuals across the Region.



As part of this work, WBF has conducted in-depth research on similar matchmaking platforms — examining both successful models and common pitfalls — in order to define the most suitable design. Technical consultations, specification drafting, and preliminary negotiations with service providers have also been carried out. Although the platform will not be operational during the two Calls foreseen in Joint Action Phase II, it is expected to be completed and fully functional before the end of the Action. Once live, it will enable users across the Western Balkans to connect, collaborate, and co-create regional initiatives with greater ease and long-term potential. his new development reaffirms our long-standing belief: cooperation begins with connection — and WBF remains at the heart of it.
